

## **Departmental Activities (2020)**

### **Seminars / Conferences/ Workshops /Training**

#### **Training of Trainers program 'Engaging Men and Boys for promoting Gender Equity'**

The department of DCE is collaborating with ROSHNI Centre organized a Training of Trainers program, 'Engaging Men and Boys for promoting Gender Equity'. The postgraduate students of the department took active part in a three-day event held on 20th, 21st, and 23rd August 2019. The programme was supported by the Centre for Health and Social Justice to increase understanding of students on gender, masculinity, and men's role in increasing gender equality, increase understanding of participatory training principles, training methodology and tools, and increase skills in designing participatory training and facilitation and orientation with PLA process of leaders in the community regarding Swabhimaan programme run by the ROSHNI centre.

#### **Workshop on Wall Writing**

A wall writing workshop was organized for undergraduate and postgraduate students of the department on 15th October 2019 in Seth Ram Lal Hall. Mr. Yogesh Saini, a wall artist and founder of Delhi Street Art was the resource person for the workshop. The students from 1st Year B.Sc. #### **Genderlogue on Sexual Harassment at workplace**

Women Power Connect (WPC) organised a two-hour Genderlogue on "Prevention of Sexual Harassment at the Workplace and The Sexual Harassment (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013" in the Department on 4th November 2019. Postgraduate and undergraduate final year Honours course students actively took part in the programme. Short films on sexual harassment were screened followed by discussion by Ms. Gayatri Sharma, Programme Director, WPC on the Sexual Harassment (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. A debate competition was

held on the same topic. ### **Field Trips/Extension Activities**

#### **Training of field functionaries**

As part of the practical training, post graduate students conduct annual training using a participatory approach for field functionaries on a development issue. In 2019, two-day Training of Trainers was organised by PG final year students for Preventing Pollution: Promoting Sanitation and Well-being on 13-14th November. Nearly 30 Field functionaries from 10 NGOS - Aman

Biradari, The Vigyan Vijay Foundation, SPYM, Action India, Astha, Maanch, TERI, and Aadhar participated in the programme. Sessions on Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan, open defecation, solid waste management, water conservation and rainwater harvesting, water pollution, and reuse of wastewater and air pollution were held. Training programme, student trainers, and the participatory training methods, techniques and material used by them was well appreciated by the participants. All the trainees and the student trainers were awarded certificates by Dr Anupa Siddhu, the Director of Lady Irwin College.



#### **Training of Adolescents for developing life skills using FTT Training Module developed by the Department**

The undergraduate students of Lady Irwin College conducted training using the 'For Today and Tomorrow - Life Skills training modules' developed by the DCE department and SPYM. Training sessions were organised by students of B.Sc. II Hons and III Pass majoring in DCE. The prime objective of these activities was to create awareness among their learners and sensitize them to take adequate actions to improve their quality of life. Teachers interacted with the student volunteers and their learners and suggested activities to be taken up by these student volunteers as part of the adult literacy -'EOEO program'.

### Seminars / Conferences/ Workshops /Training

Training programme, student trainers, and the participatory training methods, techniques and material used by them was well appreciated by the participants. All the trainees and the student trainers were awarded Certificates by Dr Anupa Siddhu, the Director of Lady Irwin College.

### **Each one Enable one programme**

This is the oldest and the most popular form of extension activity, which has been carried out by the department for 38 years. In 2019 nearly 160, third year students of B.Sc. Home Science Pass and Honours volunteered. Each volunteer spent nearly 30 hours in teaching and capacity building of the school drop-outs, adolescent girls and women from the underprivileged communities. Literacy primers developed by department 'Padhe Aur Jaane' have been primarily used to develop functional literacy skills among the learners.

### **Yuva Shakti Mela**

Undergraduate students organize a contact programme and the annual "Yuva Shakti Mela" in College campus for adult learners participating in the "Each One Enable One" programme of the department. Students put up information kiosk based on a development issue with the prime objective to create awareness among their learners and sensitize them to take adequate actions to improve their quality of life. On 12th March, 2019, the Yuva Shakti Mela was organized in the Front Lawns, Lady Irwin College. The primary audiences for the mela were the learners of the 'Each One Teach One' programme of the III year (Pass) and (Hons) students. Post Graduate students of the Department also participated in the activity along with the NSS team of the college. A couple of NGOs like SPYM, Aseem's Library, Breakthrough, Sambandh, Indian Cancer Society, NCEARD and Roshni centers of Lady Irwin College set up their stalls on the occasion. The programme was inaugurated by Ms Lalitha SA, Director, Society for Participatory Integrated Development and Dr Anupa Siddhu, Director, Lady Irwin College. Around thirty five attractive stalls with banners, AV aids and games were put up by the students on issues related to Sustainable Development Goals. Further, a street play by Akaar - the Street Play Society of Lady Irwin College was performed. EOEO project Learners shared their experiences and visited stalls. The stalls were well appreciated by the special guests and learners.

## **Other Important Events**

### **Summer Twinning Programme with Michigan State University, USA**

One of the oldest exchange programmes going on in the Department of Development Communication & Extension, Lady Irwin College, and the MSU student exchange programme was initiated almost two decades ago and ever since its inception over 128 students and 12 faculty members have crossed borders under this programme. Since a couple of years, the programme has adopted a Twinning approach, wherein students from MSU are placed with PG students of the Department under a project and share and learn together. Last year also, two students from MSU from diverse areas of specialization came in the summer and were placed with 6 Indian students from M.Sc DCE & IIIrd Year (Hons-DCE) programme under the “Ganga Project”. The twinning programme involved a week-long orientation cum series of academic lectures planned for MSU students at the department, home-stays, 50-days of internship in the hills along the periphery of river Ganga and a final presentation by the members of the programme.

### **Rural Youth Volunteers in India: HSU-LIC Twinning Programme, Supported by US Embassy in India**

The programme conceived in 2017 and executed in 2018, paired 8 students from Humboldt State University in Arcata, California (U.S.), with 8 students from Lady Irwin College, New Delhi (India) to work in two rural communities in the Baghpat district of Uttar Pradesh in northern India. The project activities were facilitated by the Environmental and Resource Organization (ESRO), a nonprofit organization, which has been working in the Baghpat district. The project was implemented in 2 villages. Four U.S./Indian pairs were placed in each community, a total of 8 pairs in two communities, ensuring that each community has an equal representation of majors/skills of these student volunteer interns. This volunteer internship experience benefited the U.S./Indian volunteer pairs by providing them with opportunities for sharing ideas, collaborating, and exchanging culture and language. This programme created tangible deliverables for the community members and built capacity among young and elderly community members.

### **Establishment of ROSHNI-Centre for Women Collectives led Social Action**

Roshni-Centre for Women Collectives led Social Action, is the collaboration between Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India & Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi that came together officially on 18th October, 2018. In order to operationalise the partnership, Lady Irwin College established a Centre on Women Collectives Led Social Action at the Department of Development Communication and Extension of the College. The College agreed to take necessary action to secure UNICEF funding for the new Centre under the existing collaborative arrangement with UNICEF (under Swabhimaan programme). The Centre is equipped with adequate human resource support consisting of external experts, advisors and consultants to provide requisite support for the convergence activities.

The Centre aims to provide technical and professional support for achievement:

- Knowledge creation
- Capacity Building for scale-up of Convergent Action Plan.
- Learning and re-learning in Swabhimaan sites as per Convergent Action Plan.
- Providing policy guidance to NRLM from time to time on POSHAN Abhiyaan initiatives.

### **Inauguration of Roshni Centre at Dept of DCE**

*LEHAR INNOVATION FUND-Innovation in Development Communication & Extension Fund, Support from alumnae and well wishers*

The Department of Development Communication and Extension (Dept of DCE) has a strong community connection and forms a key pillar in teaching, extension activities, research and transaction of curriculum. The Department of DCE has set up a fund in 2017, to promote the activities related to Development Communication & Extension and enable grassroots issues and ideas to be centre staged in the academic discourses, extension approaches and endeavours. ### Seminars / Conferences/ Workshops /Training

**The Seventeenth Raushni Deshpande Memorial Oration** was organized by Department of Development Communication and Extension, Lady Irwin College (University of Delhi) on Friday 6th April, 2018. The keynote speaker for the lecture was Prof. R Srinivas Melkote, Ohio University, USA. The topic for the oration was “Place and role of Development Communication in directed social change: Implications for the field”.

On 15th April 2018, the finale for a **Behaviour Change Strategy Competition** (Communication Catalyst 2018) was held at Mithibai College's campus, Mumbai. The aim of the competition was to understand the complex nature of the problem of malnutrition and bring into focus the importance of a multi-stakeholder approach to finding solutions and effective responses. The challenge was to build a comprehensive communication strategy that can influence children's food choices, a campaign that can make low-income households more conscious about their children's health.

**The Fifth Annual CSR debate** was held on March 9, 2018. Business and Community Foundation (BCF), had invited 12 Colleges in NCR. Eminent Jury members were drawn from diverse fields.

At the end of the debate Jury members will address the students with their feedback and suggestions. Ms. Nikita Rakhiyani, from DCE department bagged the third prize. This debating platform aimed to deepen sensitivity and understanding of the present context of Corporate Social Responsibility.

The masters students attended a panel discussion organised by the Delhi University Gender Sensitization Cell in association with Delhi University Student Union (DUSU) on the topic, ‘**#MeToo campaign** in the University’ on March 22, 2018. The panel delved into the need of a gender sensitization cell in the university spaces and also discussed the policies and politics affecting the same.

Participatory Learning and Action (PLA) techniques, survey using questionnaire, interviews and focused group discussions are used as tools for need assessment.
- Series of Mental Health Awareness sessions have been conducted by volunteers from Lady Irwin College along with Dr Aparna Khanna and Vishwas (NGO) for students from different colleges and Universities. On 8th September 2017, a session was organised for students of Amity University & Galgotia University (Greater Noida, UP) where 10 Volunteers from Lady Irwin college participated. Similar session was held at JNU on 31 September 2017 where 8 student volunteers participated. Students Volunteers of Lady Irwin College organized a Mental Health Awareness session at DurgaPuja Pandal (Faridabad) with Mind Piper (NGO). On 10 October 2017, Mental Health Awareness Campaign at AIIMS (Delhi) on the occasion of International Mental Health Day. In 2018, a session was held at Dyal Singh College with support from Richmond Fellowship Society and NSS team of Lady Irwin College.



- An educational trip to Udaipur, Rajasthan-The city of lakes was organized by the department of Development Communication and Extension, Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi. The trip was organized to attend the XXXII Biennial Conference of the Home Science Association of India on Family and Community Science: A Catalyst for Sustainable Development Goals. The conference was organized by Home Science Association of India-Rajasthan branch on 1-3 February 2018. The conference was hosted by College of Home Science, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, Rajasthan India. The conference had brought the community of Home Science together from all over India and talked about the issues and challenges of contemporary families, information technology for sustainable development and various other concerning issues by the eminent speakers from 13 different states who helped students to gain experience in the field of home science holistically.
- A visit was planned to Seva Mandir, a non-profit organization working in over 600 villages across Udaipur and Rajsamand districts of southern Rajasthan. It follows an integrated approach to community development and aims to empower communities to take collective responsibility for their own development through democratic processes. It works to empower village institutions, strengthening sustainable livelihoods and building human capabilities through variety of participatory

#### **Other Important Events**

- One of the oldest exchange programmes going on in the Department of Development Communication & Extension, Lady Irwin College, Summer Twinning Programme with Michigan State University, USA (student exchange programme) was initiated almost two decades ago and ever since its inception over 128 students and 12 faculty members have crossed borders under this programme. Since a couple of years, the programme has adopted a Twinning approach, wherein students from MSU are placed with PG students of the Department under a project and share and learn together. Last year also, four students from MSU from diverse areas of specialization came in the summer and were placed with 2 Indian students from M.Sc DCE (Final) programme under the “Ganga Project”.
- Rural Youth Volunteers in India: HSU-LIC Twinning Programme, Supported by US Embassy in India: The programme conceived in 2017 and executed in 2018, paired 8 students from Humboldt State University in Arcata, California (U.S.), with 8 students from Lady Irwin College, New Delhi (India) to work in two rural communities in the Baghpat district of Uttar Pradesh in northern India. The project activities were facilitated by the Environmental and Resource Organization (ESRO), a non-profit organization, which has been working in the Baghpat district.
- A formal orientation was planned on 18th Sept 2017 to not just welcome the new batch of students, but also celebrate the department’s birthday. Guests cum alumni. Ms. Sukriti Nag, ZMQ, Ms. Priya Kumar, CSR, Bosch India, Ms. Medha Kalsi, TARSHI and Ms. Rani Yadav, Breakthrough India, shared the experiences of working in their organisations and highlighted how the learnings from the department have been instrumental in their

professional and personal growth. The students from M.Sc Final Year, 3rd Hons DSE and SEC, 2nd Hons SEC group all showcased the the products they had prepared in the previous year and were also felicitated for the same by the retired teachers.



- The Department has set up a LEHAR INNOVATION FUND-Innovation in Development Communication & Extension Fund, Support from alumnae and well-wishers in 2017, to promote the activities related to Development Communication & Extension and enable grassroot issues and ideas to be centre staged in the academic discourses, extension approaches and endeavours. The fund is expected to help us organise a range of activities, lectures and communications that will enable to nurture and develop greater understanding of innovation, new ideas and initiatives in the dynamic field of Social and Behaviour Change Communication and Extension.

The corpus is proposed to be used for:

- Creation of a separate scholarship stream
  - Organising lecturers for promoting innovation
  - Organising workshops for promoting
- The department initiated a short term course on Corporate Social responsibility with Business and Community Foundation, New Delhi in October 2017. Business and Community Foundation is a certified CSR training organization recognised by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Several experts were invited to interact with the students and share their experiences with respect to CSR. Certificate was awarded after successful completion of the course. The course provided insights about the evolution of CSR, types of CSR, business case studies for CSR, actors and drivers, governance and CSR.

### **Departmental Activities (2017)**

#### **Seminars / Conferences/ Workshops /Training**

- The Department organised workshop on 23rd August 2016 for the masters students in

association with Mind Piper. Mind Piper is a social enterprise that currently offers workshops around mental health awareness and therapy through various channels such as over a call, video-call, or in person. They follow a holistic approach to mental health laying equal emphasis on the treatment of mental illness as on the fostering of well-being.

- Department organised a training workshop on 8th September 2016 on Digital Storytelling as a tool for Development Communication by the organization ZMQ. Students understood the concept of under-served rural communities who have no tools and content in their hands to manage their Health. And hence, Digital storytelling can revolutionize in building healthy behaviors through contextual story-telling. ZMQ has established a mobile-based digital storyteller called Your Story Teller as a new messaging tool. ZMQ Development is a non-profit organization which creates and implements practical technology linked tools & solutions to empower communities by providing timely information.



- Department organised a workshop in September 2016 on Comics as a tool for Development Communication by Mr Sharad Sharma, founder of World Comics India. Students created several comics posters and created digital stories on the theme 'NorthEast#NoStereotypes' to create awareness about stereotypes about citizens from North-East India.
- A session on life skills was held in the department on 7th September 2016. Dr. Mridula Seth, former faculty of the Department emphasized on how peer mentoring can be effective in developing life skills for marginalized youth.
- The department organised a session on Traditional Folk Media on 1st September 2016 by Dr Anjali Capila, Former Faculty of the Department. She spoke about blending Traditional Folk Media with Modern Media. She also reviewed the entertainment situations and institutions like Traditional folk theaters of rural dramatic forms including tribal mimos, dance-dramas and also puppetry.
- A session with Dr Shekhar Seshadri, Child Psychiatrist and Additional Professor at the Department of Psychiatry at NIMHANS was organized in the department on 23rd September 2016. The session was attended by the postgraduate and undergraduate students. He spoke about his work in child and adolescent mental health, including mental handicap, with a particular emphasis on adolescent therapy and adolescent sexuality. He shared his researches and other works on gender and sexuality in the context of child sexual abuse

and violence against women; and his involvement in workshop design, direct intervention, and training of counsellors.

- Prof. Sri Ram Khanna, Managing Trustee of Consumer VOICE, Consumer Association at Delhi University was invited for a session on 27th October 2016. He spoke about the widespread economic disparity, low education and ignorance in India, and how educating consumers about their rights remains a gigantic task.
- Springboard for Health Communication professionals held a workshop for the MSc Final and the MSc Previous students on 4th November 2016. The workshop was all about sharing social and behavior change communication knowledge, experiences and resources with the postgraduate and undergraduate students of the department.
- A wall writing workshop was organized for undergraduate and postgraduate students of the department in March 2017. Ms Akriti Verma from CreatifAdda was the resource person for the workshop. The session ended with all groups making one wall writing on a development issue. Three best wall writings were selected and Certificates of Appreciation were given to the students. The students from 1st Year, 3rd Year, MSc Final and MSc Previous participated in the workshop.
- To make the students understand and to address the environmental health burden of disease in India, the Centre for Environmental Health along with Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) held the seminar on 27th March 2017. The seminar was conducted with a vision to orient students towards strengthening India's public health institutional capability and provide knowledge to achieve better health outcomes for all.
- A session on Monitoring and Evaluation was conducted by Ajaz Lone, NASSCOM Foundation on 17th February 2017. The masters students were exposed to the concept of working with program managers and state implementation teams to facilitate and conduct routine monitoring and evaluation for projects implemented; conduct baseline, midterm and endline survey, plan for and facilitate process monitoring design of data collection tools, sample size and methodology of data collection.



- Ms Manjari Sharma, alumna of the department, and now a Digital Engagement Campaigner, Greenpeace India visited the department on 5th April 2017. She held a session with the MSc Final, MSc Previous and led them to develop & implement digital engagement strategies and tactics for assigned campaigns & projects and to contribute to other digital strategies.
- Dr Bhumika Jhamb, alumna of the department, and presently Programme Officer, UN Women, Delhi was invited for a session with the postgraduate students on 19th April 2017. Her session was about Gender responsive budgeting in India which has been in practice from the last ten years. She spoke in length about the assessment done on the Gender responsive budgeting in India for the current Financial Budget.

### **Special Lectures**

- Lecture by Prof. Srinivas Melkote, Ohio University, USA Professor Srinivas Melkote delivered a lecture on Development Communication for Empowerment and Social Justice in Global World on 7th December 2016. The lecture was attended by undergraduate and postgraduate students of the department. Prof Melkote talked about how the different countries fit in the parameters of inequality globally and the importance of Development Communication in addressing the same.
- Lecture by Prof Arvind Singhal, University of El Paso, Texas, USA a lecture by Prof Arvind Singhal, University of El Paso, Texas, USA on Communicative Khichdi of Social Change on 4th January 2017 was attended by the undergraduate and post-graduate students of the department. Prof Singhal talked about presumed scripts in our minds and the need to change it in order to take people along with us. He emphasized on the fact that the assumed and expected behaviour should be changed to break the hierarchy in relations but to form cordial and friendly relations with colleagues and acquaintances.

### **Field Trips/Extension Activities**

- **Yuva Shakti Mela**  
Undergraduate and post-graduate students organised the annual mela “Yuva Shakti Mela” on 23rd March 2017 in college campus for adult learners participating in the “Each One Enable One” programme of the department. While organizing the event, students put up information kiosks based on several development issues with the prime objective to create awareness among their learners and sensitize them to take adequate actions to improve their quality of life. They prepared banners, audio-visual aids, games and mobiles for 30-35 information kiosks. They mobilised nearly 200 adolescents, youth and women belonging to the marginalised groups. Ms Sonali Khan, Vice President, Breakthrough was the guest for the event.

**Value added courses and Skill enhancement activities (from NAAC reports from 2015 onwards, to be added bullet- wise)**

Department offers varied value added courses which reflect a unique blend of curriculum along with the exposure to the latest trends in related fields. Details: A two-day Training-of-Trainers (ToT) Programme was organized by final year post graduate students to promote functional literacy at grassroots level using a participatory approach.
