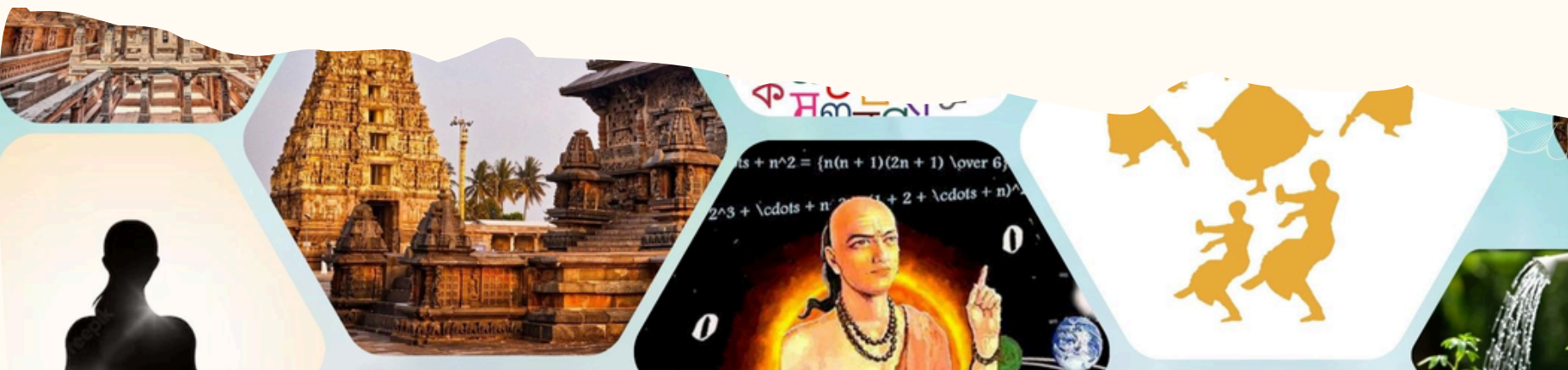

# PAPER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

## ABSTRACT :

The abstract should not exceed 300 words. It should clearly state the objective, methodology, summary of results and implications. It should also include title of the abstract, the author's name, and designation, institutional affiliation, mailing address, contact number and E-mail ID. The abstract should be typed in (Times New Roman font size as 12/ Krutidev font size 14) with 1.5 line spacing. Abstract may be sent to the Department of Education, Lady Irwin College (University of Delhi) through email [conferenceonlearning@lic.du.ac.in](mailto:conferenceonlearning@lic.du.ac.in) latest by 5<sup>th</sup> October , 2025.

## FULL PAPER :

The length of full paper including tables, diagrams, illustrations, references, etc. should be between 3000 to 5000 words. The full paper should be typed in English/Hindi font (Times New Roman, Font size 12 / Krutidev in size 14) with 1.5 lining space is acceptable. Bibliographical references should be arranged alphabetically and given at the end of the text in the APA 7 format only. The full version of paper should be submitted in soft copy latest by 10<sup>th</sup> November , 2025.

After reviewing the abstracts and full papers, information regarding acceptance, modification, rejection and presentation shall be communicated to the authors subsequently.
